

SUMMARY ANNUAL REPORT
For Vanderbilt University Welfare Benefit Plan

This is a summary of the annual report of the Vanderbilt University Welfare Benefit Plan, EIN 62-0476822, Plan No. 513, for period 01/01/2023 through 12/31/2023. The annual report has been filed with the Employee Benefits Security Administration, U.S. Department of Labor, as required under the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Vanderbilt University has committed itself to pay certain self-insured Medical and Prescription Drug claims incurred under the terms of the plan.

Insurance Information

The plan has contracts with Aetna Life Insurance Company, Hartford Life and Accident, Metropolitan Life Insurance Company, and Delta Dental of Tennessee to pay Medical, Dental, Vision, Life Insurance, Short-term Disability, Long-term Disability, Accidental Death and Dismemberment, and Business Travel Accident claims incurred under the terms of the plan. The total premiums paid for the plan year ending 12/31/2023 were \$7,712,167.

Because they are so called "experience-rated" contracts, the premium costs are affected by, among other things, the number and size of claims. Of the total insurance premiums paid for the plan year ending 12/31/2023, the premiums paid under such "experience-rated" contracts were \$3,141,623 and the total of all benefit claims paid under these contracts during the plan year was \$3,216,111.
