Walk-in clinic

For minor health issues. Often found in stores and pharmacies.

Average wait time: 15 minutes¹

Average cost of visit: \$33*



Urgent care center

Quick care for serious but not life-threatening situations.

Average wait time: 15–45 minutes²

Average cost of visit: \$61*



Emergency room

For emergencies that can permanently impair or endanger your life.

Average wait time: 2.5 hours² (for non-emergencies)

Average cost of visit: \$377*

Finding a clinic is easy

Get familiar with the urgent care and walk-in clinics in your neighborhood before you need them. Here's how:

- Go to **aetnainternational.com** and log in to Health Hub with your username and password
- Using the drop-down boxes under "Find Health Care," select United States, then click "Search" to find a doctor near you
- You'll be directed to your member website at **aetna.com** and you can search for either "Walk in Clinics" or "Urgent Care Centers"

Seven great reasons to try a walk-in clinic or urgent care center

Here's why you should consider a walk-in clinic or urgent care center next time you need non-life threatening care:

- 1. No appointment needed. Just walk right in.
- 2. **Convenient hours.** Some are open seven days a week, with extended evening, weekend and holiday hours.
- 3. **Lower prices.** You'll almost always pay lower copays and out-of-pocket costs than you will at an ER.
- 4. **Less waiting.** The average ER visit is significantly longer than a visit to a walk-in or urgent care facility.
- 5. **Many locations.** It's easy to find a walk-in or urgent care facility near you.
- 6. **Fully staffed.** Urgent care centers are overseen by doctors with doctors providing the service, while walk-in clinics are overseen by doctors with nurse practitioners or physician assistants onsite.
- 7. **Connections with local ERs.** If you need more extensive care, you'll be referred to the closest ER.
